**Sugar House Named “Best Old House Neighborhood” by This Old House Magazine**  
*Recognition of Area’s Historic Architecture and Unique Community to be Celebrated at Summit  
Event*

SALT LAKE CITY – After searching the U.S. and Canada for neighborhoods with architectural significance and special appeal to “old-house-loving buyers,” This Old House magazine recently selected Sugar House as one of 51 “Best Old House Neighborhoods” of 2009. Established in 1853 and named for a local sugar mill, Sugar House’s walkable neighborhood and historic charm attract homebuyers, businesses, visitors and shoppers to this desirable area of Salt Lake City.

“Sugar House is a unique section of Salt Lake City with its lively hub of local shops, businesses and historic homes,” said Mayor Ralph Becker. “Congratulations to the Sugar House community for its recognition as a Best Old House Neighborhood and for fostering a warm, welcoming environment in our City.”

Westminster College and Community Studio, a local architecture, planning and urban design firm focused on community-building initiatives, will celebrate this special designation of Sugar House at the second of a four-part Sugar House Summit series held Saturday, Nov. 14 from 10:00 a.m. to noon at the Health and Wellness Center of Westminster College. Focused on capturing and preserving the rich history and personal stories of the area, the summit aims to

better connect the community. Preservation efforts of the Sugar House and Wasatch Hollow Community Councils will also be available for public review.

Attendees are invited to bring old photos or items related to the area to digitize for inclusion in a detailed historic documentation of Sugar House. The historic documentation and electronic library will be publicly available as a means for the community to identify with the neighborhood and its rich history.
