Mayor's Office of Diversity and Human Rights to Host Antidiscrimination Workshop *Community to Receive Legal Rights in the Workplace Training in Spanish*

SALT LAKE CITY – The Salt Lake City Mayor's Office of Diversity and Human Rights will join Centro Civico Mexicano and other community partners to host an antidiscrimination in employment workshop on Tuesday, October 5 at 6:30 p.m. at Centro Civico Mexicano, 155 South 600 West. Topics include workplace safety, fair employment practices, minimum wage requirements, and other employment issues.

The Mayor's Antidiscrimination Campaign was launched in August 2010 to educate employees and employers about their rights and responsibilities. Partners include the Utah Labor Commission, Workers Compensation Fund, and American Civil Liberties Union. Tuesday's workshop, to be provided in Spanish, is the third workshop offered since the campaign began.

"We seek to achieve a City where residents can work and do business free from discrimination," said Mayor Becker. "Educating our community about human rights is a vital key to helping us realize our goals."
